The coaches are selected to assist defensemen, goalies and forwards on how to prepare their games for HIGH SCHOOL, POST-HIGH SCHOOL, MIDGET/JUNIOR play.

On-Ice:

- Two 1.5 hour sessions of intense on-ice instruction daily.
- Small-ice games training designed to enhance players' ability to move and think at high speeds and in crowded areas.

- Off-ice training in problem solving and leadership skills, goal-setting and preparation.
- Hockey workshop designed to introduce players to the many levels of hockey (college, junior, prep school, etc.)
- Recruiting classroom introducing players & parents to the recruiting game and where to go to be seen by the right people.

Head Instructor: Bill Beaney

1986-present: Head Men's Hockey Coach, Middlebury College
Selected as New England College Hockey Coach Of The Year 5 times, as well as

National Coach Of The Year in 1990, 1995, 2004, 2006, Bill Beaney has redefined hockey coaching in the United States. His small ice techniques of



coaching have been adapted worldwide to improve players' abilities to play, and more importantly, to think, at the highest levels of ice hockey. From 1995-1999, the coach guided Middlebury College to five consecutive Div. III National Championships. Middlebury also claimed National Championships in 2004 & 2005. Coach Beaney is also heavily involved in USA Hockey, serving as head coach for USA Hockey's Junior Olympic Team (1985-87), National Women's Junior Team (1996-97) as well as an assistant with the 1994 Junior National Team.

Asst. Head Instructor: Mark Taylor

2001-present: Head Men's Hockey Coach, Hobart College

The 2003 ECAC West Coach Of The Year and a finalist for the AHCA National Coach Of The Year, Mark Taylor has directed a renaissance of the



Hobart hockey program. Now entering his eighth season with the Statesmen, he joined the Hobart family after spending five seasons as the top assistant coach at the University of Massachusetts at Lowell. An active member of the hockey community, Taylor has coached in the USA Hockey Development Program for several years, including the Select 14 Development Camp this past Summer in Rochester. With the Division I UMass-Lowell River Hawks, Taylor was involved in all aspects of coaching and was in charge of recruiting. A highly successful recruiter, he attracted five players to UMass-Lowell who were selected in the NHL draft, including the Montreal Canadiens 1999 first-round pick (13th overall) Ron Hainsey.

Asst. Head Instructor: Neil Sinclair

2005-present: Head Men's Ice Hockey Coach, Skidmore College

Neil Sinclair enters his third year as Head Men's Hockey Coach for Skidmore following one year as Head Women's Coach at Williams College. He spent the 2002-03 season as the Interim Head Coach of the Middlebury College Men's Ice Hockey Team. They compiled a record of 22-5-2 on the way to a first place regular season finish in the NESCAC and a berth in the NCAA tournament where they lost to Oswego State in the



Semi-finals. Sinclair is a 1993 graduate of Middlebury College where he was a First Team All-American and ECAC First Team member in 1993. An active member of USA Hockey, Sinclair has coached regional teams such as Vermont's 1997 "Make-A-Wish" team, the Vermont Select 15's in the Yankee Conference Festival, presented at USA Hockey's New England Coaching Symposium and Program of Merit, and worked at the USA Hockey Select 14 Festival for boys and girls.

Matt graduated from Hotchkiss School and the University of Michigan in 1998, majoring in Psychology. He was a 4-year letter winner in both hockey and baseball at Michigan, who won the NCAA Div. I National Championship in his sophomore and senior year, the later when he was Captain. During his freshman year, he was drafted by the Washington Capitals and the Atlanta Braves. He played professional hockey in the NHL, ANHL, and



Europe, and with US National Team in 1999. He is also founder of Matt Herr's Power Skating.
